 forme followinge first I comend my Soule into the handes of Almightie
 God my Maker and Redeemer, And my bodie to be buried in Christian burieall
 the Discretion of my Executors hereafter named hereing through the Merits of
 Christ my Saviour in that all the last day be raised againe and Raigned with
 him in his Eternall Glory, And as for my worldly goodes and Estates wherof
 with the force of his infinite mercy have I bene favored to bestow most freely and
 liberally in my auncient and former times after the best sort that I can and becometh
 unto Dauidell Fowler my Sonne and unto his wyfe and assignee for ever, All
 that my now dwelling house, but how soe, garden Orchard and the said dead
 things therof belonginge Situate lyinge and beinge in Kinges Stanley aforesaid
 And also all that parcel of Meadow ground lyinge in the parson meadow
 the place of Wylth. the which said gentleman, which parcel of land I have
 bought whiche I purchased of James Dabbly, and the parcel of land in a
 field called the Motherfilds whiche I purchased of Wylth Dabbly, and also
 in a field called Downnott, and another parcel in a field called Piddesdown
 All with said parcels of land are in Kinges Stanley aforesaid from and im-
 mediately after my decease and the residue of my said my now wife Anne
 and hereing into the said Dauidell Fowler my Sonne and my daughter
 of Curraunt, Aleney, And my Will and desire is that hee the sayd Dauidell
 Fowler his Executors Administrators and assignee doo siting of their state, whiche
 may yearly and every yeare five poundes of Curraunt English money into the
 said my now wife, duringe the whole terme of her naturall life, beinge
 the interest by the said my daughter Anne hereing her selfe with and in
 my name shall if shee happen to marry my Will and desire is that shee shall
 have the said hereing and heres before mentioned and from thome hereing
 immediately after her marriage and for her lively hood after her marriage I bequeath
 to her Sonnes poundes a yeare do be paid unto her yearly of Curraunt English
 Money duringe the terme of her naturall life, by Dauidell Fowler my Sonne his
 her two Executors Administrators Assignee whiche state except of her portion
 of five hundred and bequeath unto his daughter of Dauidell Fowler my daughter
 of Curraunt English money do be paid unto her when shee shall accomplish the
 Age of Twentie years or more I give and bequeath unto Elizabeth another
 daughter of the said Dauidell Fowler my daughter of Curraunt English
 Money do be paid her at the age of Twentie years or more I give and bequeath
 the said my daughter Elizabeth daughter of the said Dauidell Fowler my daughter
 of Curraunt English money do be paid her as from as shee shall accomplish the
 Age of Twentie years or more I give and bequeath unto the said Elizabeth my now wife
 the said Dauidell Fowler my becoming, if it come to his Sonnes poundes of
 Curraunt English money if it shall accomplish the Age of Twentie years or more
 if any of the said children shall happen to decease before the accomplishment
 of the said Age my Will and desire is that his her or their portion here named
 and bequeathes shall remaine unto the Curraunt of them Equally divided
 I give and bequeath unto John Dabbly of Stenshouse my Sonne in Law three
 poundes of Curraunt English money And I give and bequeath unto his
 daughter Anne Dabbly of Stenshouse five hundred and bequeath unto her and
 heres the said my daughter of Curraunt English money
