In the Name of God Amen I Daniel Fowler of the County of Devon in the County of Devonshire Sheriff being in perfect memory thanks be given unto Almighty God doe make this my last Will and Testament in manner here expressed I do give and bequeath my Soul into the hands of Almighty God my Maker and Redeemer and my body to be buried in Christian Buriall at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named with assured hope that at the last day it shall be raised againe and by the merits of Christ enjoye with him in eternall glory And as for my worldly substance wherewith God hath blessed me I give in manner following I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Giffard and unto the sume of thye hundred poundes a peece wherof I doe bequeath a peece unto my sonne Sir John Fowler my late father whiche said sume hundred poundes a peece my will is shall be compde headed in the said three hundred poundes And I give and bequeath unto my other daughter Myrtal and Sarah the sume of three hundred poundes a peece to be paid to every and either of my said daughters at thye severall dayes of Marriage And if they happen wth in marriage without being accomplished the age of one and twenty years then my will and meaning is that from thenceforth the interest of thye said severall portions and sumes of money shall be paid them untill thye age or age of thye said years or dayes of Marriage which or either of the said times my will is thye said severall portions and sumes of money shall be paid them by some person or persons to be named provided that if either of them dye before thye dayes or times before mentioned that then her or thye part or portion here by given shall not be payable to any other but be as if no such Legacy or bequest had been made or given Item I give and bequeath unto my sonne John Fowler in Law the sume of fforty poundes to be paid within one year after my decess Item I give unto Jane my wife of the said County of Devon the life sume of fforty poundes to be paid within one year after my decess Item I give unto Sir John Fowler the son Twenty shillings and unto Elizabeth daughter of my said daughter the life sume of Twenty shillings Item I give unto Anne daughter afore said twenty shillings whiche said last Legacies to be paid at one year and after my decess Item my will is that my trust and loving friends Daniel Giffard the Mayor of the City of Exeter Thomas Giffard of Walling in the Parish of Roadborough Sheriff of Devonshire and in the County of Devon Giffard and Austin Fowler of Moorewell in the said County of Devonshire and or the survivor or survivors of them or the major part of them shall and may and lawfully give them power and authority to demise let and sell all or any my messuages messuages Lands Tenements and hereditaments with service and the Rents and profits thereof to receive unto my son Daniel Fowler shall accomplish the age of one and twenty years And that they or either of them shall and may receive and add out of the interest and interest of all sumes of money shall receive and pay for sufficient maintenance for the breeding and educating my said children untill such time as my said son shall arrive to the age of one and twenty years and at such age my will is my said son shall be at the charge of thye education and breeding until thye said severall dayes of Marriage or age of one and twenty years And I hereby desire my loving kinsman the said Mr Thomas Webb or Thomas Clutterbuck to breed up and instruct my said son in the Trade of Clothing in the house and family of him the said Mr Webb or Mr Thomas Clutterbuck untill my said son be of the age of twenty one years and to receive and receive sufficient and reasonable allowance for the same Item if my personal estate shall not suffice to pay and discharge the said Legacies sumes of money and portions hereby devised or to be devised I shall then be contented to the said Daniel Giffard Thomas Giffard Thomas Clutterbuck and Austin Fowler the survivor or survivors of them or the major part of them to receive so much of the Rents issues and profits whiche they shall have received to add to and make up the said severall portions and sumes of money hereby given And if it shall happen that shall not have

 Anselm Flower and their heirs and assigns shall have raised and raised out of the Fruits
 Issues and profits thereof so much and such sum of money sufficient to complete and
 make up the said Legacies and bequests herebefore set forth to be liquidated And I have
 constituted and appointed the said Daniel Lysons Thomas Gress Thomas Scatterbooke and
 Anselm Flower Executors of the said my last Will and Testament in trust for and until
 my said Son shall attain the age of one and twenty years And at such age I make my
 Son my Heir and sole Executor of my said Will and the said Daniel Lysons Thomas Gress
 Thomas Scatterbooke and Anselm Flower to give a true and reasonable Account to
 my said Son of such receipts as aforesaid upon which Account to be made it shall
 be lawful to and for the said Daniel Lysons Thomas Gress Thomas Scatterbooke
 Anselm Flower or any or either of them to make defalcation and receive such reasonable
 sum of money for his or their parts and expenses in performing and executing
 the trust of the said Will and also in prosecuting and defending my said Son in Law or
 Equities and in carrying the said my last Will and Testament And in further gratitude
 to the said Executors and diligence herein to be employed I give and bequeath unto them
 and each of them the sum of three hundred and a piece in Writs whereof I have reserved

 to hold to him his heirs Executors and assigns respectively Item I give unto
 the said William Fullwood and his heirs forever one partell of Land lying in the
 Parish of Godmanchester in the County of Huntington aforesaid now in the occupation
 of Thomas Gress of Godmanchester aforesaid Item I give unto the said William
 Fullwood all my interest and terme of years yet to come and purchased in one last
 made to me by the most honorable Elizabeth late Countess Dowager of Exeter
